SPECIAL ATTENTION MANCHESTER RESIDENTS

Last night (October 13, 2015) during late night hours we had multiple vehicles broken into via unlock doors. With the exception of one which contained a loaded hand gun, all others involved little to no property being taken. The majority of the crime spree occurred in the Cross Road/Whispering Valley Communities. A separate event occurred on Main Street involving the theft of a GPS out of an unlocked vehicle.

If anyone has any information regarding a suspect(s) or possible suspect(s) please contact us. **Your information will remain confidential.** The majority of this type of crime involves drug users, juveniles and or area recidivist. If anyone has any information on a group called the **“KUSH CLUB” PLEASE CONTACT US!**

- **Please remember to lock all doors and take time to remind your neighbors. Keep exterior lights on. Report Suspicious Activity and person(s).**
- **Always roll up the windows and lock the car, even if it's in front of your home.**
- **Never leave valuables in plain view, even if your car is locked. Put them in the trunk or at least out of sight.**
- **DO NOT LEAVE FIREARMS OR AMMUNITION IN YOU VEHICLES. THIS IS NOT A SECURE LOCATION. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR GUNS!**
- **Remove portable electronic devices such as smart phones and GPS navigation systems, including suction cup or bean bag type mount. (Even the visible appearance of a suction cup ring on the glass windshield can be an enticement to a thief to break in and look for the GPS system.)**
- **Report suspicious persons and activity.**

We will continue to keep you posted on our findings and all need to know information.
