UNLICENSED VEHICLES

In accordance with Ordinance 233-1 it is unlawful to keep any motor vehicle without registration plates or expired tags on any property within the Town unless it is enclosed in a garage or other building.

Zoning Info You Should Know....

All **fences** must be approved for type, location & height by the Town before installation. Please bring a copy of your plat to receive a zoning certificate. No Chain link fences.

Construction of all **decks**, **pools & sheds** require a building permit issued by Carroll County Permits. The County will then submit to the Town of Manchester.

Dwellings, lots, and yards with trash, debris, and high grass are violations of the Town Code. Violation of this ordinance is \$50 for the first offense and \$100.00 for each repeat offense.

Filling of **pools** and **watering of lawns** is **prohibited** with town water sources. Outside vendors must be used. Violation of this ordinance is \$100 for first offense and \$200 for each repeat offense.



The Water Use Moratorium states that no residential user of water shall use water for the purposes of watering or sprinkling lawns or for the filling of pools or ponds of any nature. Violators will be fined.



Help make everyone's outdoor experience pleasurable. Remember to pick up after your dog as you take walks around town. Remember that animals running at large <u>include</u> <u>cats</u> as well as dogs. Any owner found in violation will be fined \$50.


