UNLICENSED VEHICLES

In accordance with Ordinance 233-1 it is unlawful to keep any motor vehicle without registration plates or expired tags on any property within the Town unless it is enclosed in a garage or other building.

FENCE INFO!

All fences must be approved for type, location & height by the Town **before** installation. Please bring a copy of your plat to the Town Hall to receive a zoning certificate. No chain link fences.



Construction of all decks, pools & sheds require a building permit issued by Carroll County Permits. The County will then submit to the Town of Manchester.

Dwellings, lots, and yards with **trash, debris, and high grass** are violations of the Town Code. Violation of this ordinance is \$50 for the first offense and \$100.00 for each repeat offense.



Help make everyone's outdoor experience pleasurable. Remember to pick up after your dog as you take walks around town. Remember that animals running at large **include cats** as well as dogs. Any owner found in violation will be fined \$50.



PRING PICK-**UPS**

Brush pick-up will be on April 14th. Remember that your pile must be no larger than four feet in height, four feet in width and eight in length. Each property will receive ONE pick-up.

Yard waste consists of grass clippings, leaves and small branches not in excess of 3 feet and/or 4" in diameter. Branches must be bundled in arm-full loads. Yard waste should not be mixed with mulch, dirt, or any residential refuse, including pest waste. Residents should place lawn waste curbside on Thursday evening for Friday's pickup.

All yard waste must be placed in large Kraft paper bags or in a container to be dumped. NO PLASTIC BAGS!



Stormwater Pollution Prevention for the Homeowner

Stormwater is water that originates from a precipitation event, such as rain or snow. Some of this water soaks into the ground. What the ground cannot absorb when the rain falls is called stormwater runoff. The water not absorbed into the ground flows off your property and drains into nearby streams, reservoirs, and other waterways. Eventually, it makes its way to the Chesapeake Bay.

Pervious surfaces are those areas where the ground absorbs stormwater, such as grassy areas, pastures, and farm fields. The larger the pervious surface area, the greater the opportunity for stormwater to be absorbed into the ground before flowing off into streams and storm drains. Water absorbed seeps into the soil and replenishes the local groundwater, which supplies water to local wells.

Impervious surfaces are areas where the ground is too hard to absorb water, such as gravel driveways, or where the ground is covered by other surfaces that cannot absorb water. Examples of impervious surfaces include roads, parking lots, buildings, driveways, and sidewalks. Water that falls on these impervious surfaces is forced to run off and go elsewhere.

Storm drains are installed in most areas where development is more concentrated, such as in and around our municipalities and growth areas. In Carroll County and its municipalities, water that flows into these storm drains does **not** get treated at a wastewater treatment plant. Some storm drains lead directly to streams and waterways, while other storm drains direct water to a stormwater management facility that treats or filters the stormwater before it is released into a stream. It is very important to construct and maintain these facilities to help improve the water quality in our streams and waterways. Minimizing the amount of water and pollutants these facilities need to handle and treat will extend their lifespan and allow for longer periods between maintenance upgrades. Keep in mind that ditches and swales along the roads or across properties are part of the storm drain system and must be kept clean as well.
